Precautions for use

This approved DECT telephone is intended to be used with an ALCATEL cordless PABX.

The following conditions of use must be respected, particularly as regards the use of radioelectric frequencies:

- DECT equipment can only be used to establish links between fixed points if these links are temporary and the equivalent isotropically radiated power at the antenna is less than 250 mW.
- The conditions of access to a DECT equipment telepoint network shall be stipulated by contract with the operator of the authorized telepoint network concerned.

This telephone is specially designed for use with an Alcatel OmniPCX 4400 system as described in the guide.

Do not expose your telephone to severe conditions (rain, sea air, dust, etc.).

Correct operation of your telephone is not guaranteed in temperatures outside the range -10 $^{\circ}$ C to +45 $^{\circ}$ C.

You must not switch on or use your telephone near gas or inflammable liquids.

You have just acquired a **Mobile 100** or **200** and we thank you for making this choice: it is a reliable telephone designed to make life easier for you.

I. Display and corresponding icons

The display features I line of status icons and 3 lines of 16 alphanumerical characters. The Mobile 200 also features a display and backlit keypad.

1 1. Status icons

The status icons are displayed on the welcome screen and indicate the status of the telephone.

- Battery charge level
- Messages received:
 voice and text messages, call-back requests and unanswered
 calls
- Calls received that have remained unanswered (if no other types of message)
- 5. Forward activated
- A Ringer active
- Vibrator active (Mobile 200)
- A Ringer disabled
- Programmed call-back time
- Radio reception quality

You can obtain details on the status icons from the tooltips that appear on the welcome screen when you use the navigator:





Press the key to make these tooltips disappear.

2. MENU icons

The MENU is accessible from the welcome screen by pressing the







Directories:

manage your personal directory and access the phone book.



Redial:

call back one of the last 6 numbers dialled.



Forwarding:

forward your calls to another number.



Mail:

consult the messages and send voice and text messages.

Adjustment:

4. How to read this guide



Move the navigation key up or down.

Move the navigation key to the left or right.

Use the keypad to enter digits and letters.

Important information.

These symbols can be supplemented by small icons or texts.

All default or customized function codes are given in the table of codes supplied with the telephone.

The functions described in this guide only concern telephones programmed in multiline mode which is the default configuration when the mobile is installed.

2. Getting started

2 1. Charging the telephone

• Installing the battery:



Position the battery in the slide following the mark on the label



Slide it until it clicks into place



• Charging the battery:



Connect the charger and place the telephone in the charging holder



The battery is charged*.
The light is on and the battery icon is displayed.

Recharge your telephone battery regularly. The telephone can be on or off when recharging the battery.

If the telephone is to remain unused or out of its charger for several weeks, remove the battery and store it separately.

The **Mobile 100** functions exclusively with the Ni-Mh battery, and the **Mobile 200** with the Li-Ion battery.

1. Making a call





To make an external call, dial the outside line access code before your correspondent's number.

3 2. Answering a call



You are receiving a call

Off-hook

You are in conversation

Hang up




The ringer does not ring if:

- the vibrator is active and the ringer is disabled, the (B) icon is displayed on the welcome screen,
- the ringer is disabled and the icon is displayed on the welcome screen.

The light flashes if both the ringer and the vibrator are disabled.






You can also activate your directory by using the "Phone Book" option of the function.

3 5. Calling back one of the last 6 numbers dialled (Redial)

To call back the last number dialled press (long press).




3 6. Making a call-back request






5 4. Making another type of forward

You can program call forward on busy, on no reply, etc.





Select the "List of forwards" icon



Select the type of forward then confirm



Confirm the "Activate Fwd" selection for a diversion to the same number



Select "Modify Fwd" and confirm to change the destination number


5. Consulting the messages left while you were away

You can consult the messages left while you were away: voice messages, call-back requests, text messages, list of internal and external calls.



If you use the "Call Back" option, the request is deleted even if your call is not answered. Otherwise the request is stored until the "Delete" option is selected.

Lists of unanswered internal or external calls

The procedure for consulting the lists of unanswered internal or external calls is identical to that for the call-back requests. To access them, select the \triangle^{int} (internal) or \triangle^{ext} (external) icons.

If you use the "Call Back" option, the message is deleted if your call is answered. Otherwise the request is stored until the "Delete" option is selected

Customizing your telephone 6.

1. Programming your password

You will need to enter your password to activate certain functions:





6 2. Creating a sheet in your personal directory

Your personal directory can contain up to 12 numbers.



(*) To enter the name: the keys of the numerical keypad have letters that can be displayed by pressing the key the appropriate number of times in succession. A grid at the base of the display indicates the selected character. Example: press "8" two times in succession to display the letter "U".

In case of error, use the key to delete.


6 3. Activating the vibrator or ringer (Mobile 200)



This key can be used to switch rapidly from the ringer to the vibrator and vice-versa.

6 4. Customizing the ringer

· Choosing the melody and volume



• Rapid customizing of the ringer

Depending on your activity, the ringer parameters can be modified rapidly by a short press on the key and then using the key.



- ② Activate / disable the vibrator (Mobile 200)
- $\ensuremath{\,^{\circ}}$ $\ensuremath{\,^{\circ}}$ R Activate / disable the ringer
- Activate / disable meeting mode (progressive ringing)
- $\ensuremath{{\mathbb S}}$ Activate the keyboard lock

Several models of charger are available.

• Battery charging time:

• Characteristics of the mains power adapter:

Input : 230 V - 50 Hz Output : 12 V DC - 500 mA



The mains power socket used must be close to the charger/holder and easily accessible, so that it can be used as an "on/off" facility.

Transporting and protecting your telephone

Various models of carrying case are available. Ask your installation technician for information.

It is vital to use the special protective carrying case if your telephone is to be used in an industrial environment (presence of dust, filings, vapours of diverse origins and risk of being dropped).

Warranty

Independently of the legal warranty that covers this appliance, it is guaranteed for I year, parts and labour, counting from the date indicated on your invoice. Nevertheless, if the legal warranty in effect in your country exceeds I year, then the legal warranty is the sole warranty applicable.
